Caleb Lumen Pungowiyi was a revered global leader raised with the traditions of his St. Lawrence Island Yupik heritage. Throughout his life via leadership positions he held across the Arctic, he led efforts to sustain traditional practices in a modern world by bridging traditional Alaska Native and modern science communities. To carry forward his life's work, and with generous support from the Oak Foundation, Kawerak, Inc. is honored to invite the next generation of Alaska Native students interested in making an impact through research, policy, and advocacy to become a part of the Caleb Scholars Program.

Eligibility

You are eligible to apply if you meet the following requirements:

- Enrolled as a tribal member in a tribe from the Norton Sound, Northwest Arctic, or Arctic Slope regions
- Enrolled in a preferred degree program (listed in policies) at an accredited university or college
- If an undergraduate student, must have already completed 36 credit hours toward a preferred degree program
- Have cumulative and current grade point averages of 2.5 or higher as an undergraduate student *or* 3.0 or higher as a graduate student
- Registered for at least 12 credit hours for the upcoming semester as an undergraduate student *or* full-time equivalent as a graduate student

Application Checklist

A complete application packet consists of these required documents:

- New Scholarship Application
- Responses to all three essay questions
- Verification of tribal enrollment
- Electronic or paper transcripts (unofficial or official transcripts)
- Class registration for the upcoming semester showing full-time enrollment
- Two letters of recommendation

Incomplete applications will not be processed or considered for award funds.

- December 1 (Spring Semester)
- July 31 (Fall Semester)
- Materials will not be accepted past 11:59 p.m. Alaska Standard Time on the appropriate deadline.
